Freshman Year

- o Focus on your academics every year matters to colleges
- o Work on developing strong time management and study skills
- o Build a "Four-Year Plan" based on graduation/college requirements and your interests
- o Get involved with activities and causes that matter to you
- o Attend college fairs/ Visit local colleges' open houses
- o Look at admission statistics for colleges that interest you and set goals

Sophomore Year

- o Continue to be diligent with your coursework
- o Explore your interests through clubs, sports, and community organizations
- o Build strong positive relationships with your teachers
- o Take the PSAT in the fall and the ACT Aspire test (Practice ACT exam) in the spring
- o Attend college fairs/ visit local college open houses
- o Look for summer opportunities to explore interests, and career possibilities, or gain a skill
- o Complete the personality and career assessments in Naviance.
- o Create a resume of your activities and community involvement in Naviance
- o Update your "Four Year Plan" and meet with your advisor to choose classes for your junior year and discuss your college goals.

Junior Year

- o Focus on academics and consider challenging yourself with advanced coursework
- o Think about which teachers you would like to ask to write letters of recommendation for you.
- o Look for leadership opportunities
- o Research potential majors
- o Research potential colleges based on interests, GPA, and PSAT/ACT Aspire
- o Build a potential college list.
- o Assess your strengths, transcripts, and areas for improvement
- o Look for summer opportunities to explore interests, and career possibilities, or gain a skill
- o Meet with your academic and college counselors to plan for college and set goals

Summer before Senior Year

- o Learn the application procedure for the schools where you are applying
- o Organize your resume activities, community service, leadership
- o Draft your application essays
- o Intern/work/volunteer/ take a class

Senior Year

- o Focus on academics Make sure you are keeping a healthy balance
- o Apply to college
- o Consider taking the SAT or ACT in the fall of senior year

- o Keep track of usernames and passwords for college portals
- o February: Cal Grant Forms are due

- o May 1: Deadline to decide which college to attend
